2. Face Mask Collection Drive (07-14 December 2020)

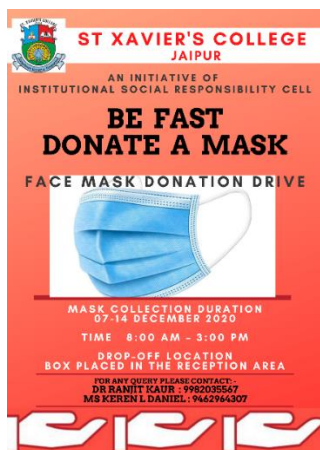

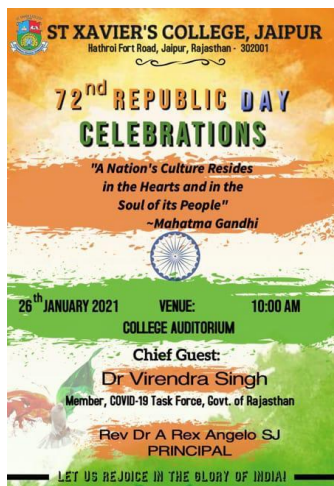
4. Puppet Show - By Youth Wing of World Vision India, Jaipur (26 January 2021)

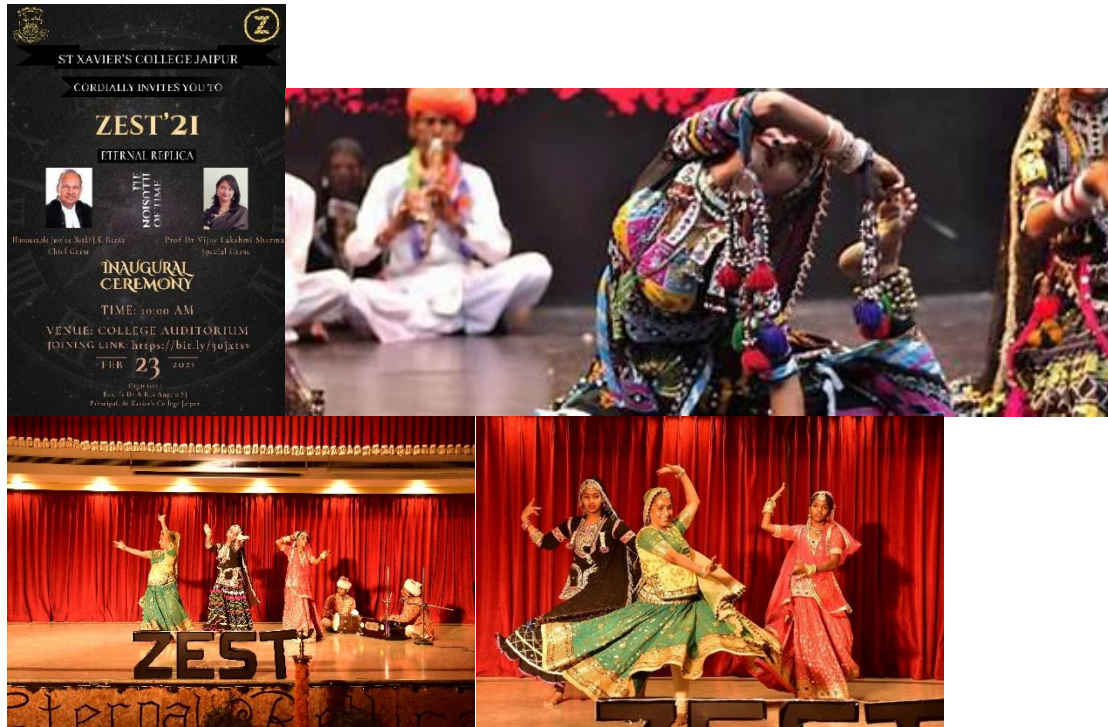
**7. Kalbelia Dance Performance - Social Activity to Uplift the Weaker Society
