An interactive session on GST (Goods and Services Tax) was organised by the Department of Commerce on 17 October 2019. The speaker for the session was FCA Varnit, Faculty, Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

In his lecture, he gave an in-depth view of GST which is considered as a major reform in the Indian Taxation System. He began with an enlightening note emphasizing on the basics of revenue collection with respect to the Federal Structure of India. Taking real-life situations as examples, he traced the development of the new tax regime and also explained the various tax concepts like direct/indirect taxes, regression/progression related to taxes, etc.

He discussed at length the challenges to the implementation of GST in the current economic scenario of the country. He elucidated the salient features of GST, such as it being a destinationbased taxation scheme, with a holistic view, embracing pros and cons of each. The lecture was enriching for the students, and it ended up with question and answer session.



The Literati Cell organised a Group Discussion in the college auditorium. Students, mostly from the English department, participated in the event rendering it an immediate success. Topics for discussion ranged from "What is true literature?" to "Should art be for art's sake?" and the active participation made it an event one wouldn't want to miss. In about 40 minutes of active discussion, bordering on debate, one thing was easy to figure out that literature is subjective. The thing which sums up the discussion and the only thing which everybody agreed on is, "Literature is the embodiment of emotions and feelings, and just like them, it is wholly subjective". Thus, the discussion ended on the note that "literature has its own beauty and that is mind manipulation, the literature which makes the readers feel good and bring change in it is a good literature."


