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Embracing NEP 2020: An Educational Initiative

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 is an education policy introduced in India that aims to bring about significant reforms in the country's education system. It was approved by the Union Cabinet of India on July 29, 2020. The policy is designed to replace the National Policy on Education (NPE) 1986 and its subsequent modifications.

Key features and objectives of the NEP 2020, related to higher education are as follows:

- Holistic Education: The policy emphasizes a shift from traditional learning to a more holistic learning with a multidisciplinary approach. It aims to promote critical thinking, creativity, and problemsolving skills among students.
- Multidisciplinary Approach: Encourages multidisciplinary education and flexibility in choosing subjects. Students will have the freedom to select subjects across streams, including arts, sciences, and vocational subjects.
- Vocational Education: The policy seeks to integrate vocational education into mainstream education, allowing students to acquire practical skills alongside theoretical knowledge.

- Higher Education: It envisions a more flexible and multidisciplinary higher education system. It recommends the introduction of a four-year undergraduate program with multiple exit options and a common entrance exam for universities.
- Technology Integration: It emphasizes the use of technology in education, including online resources, digital classrooms, and e-learning platforms.
- Assessment Reforms: The policy suggests moving away from a rigid examination-focused system and adopting a more comprehensive and continuous assessment approach.
- Equity and Inclusion: It focuses on bridging gaps in education access and quality, particularly among disadvantaged and marginalized groups.
- **Regulatory Bodies:** The policy proposes the establishment of a single overarching regulatory body for the entire higher education sector, replacing multiple existing regulatory authorities.

It aims to transform India's education system to meet the demands of the 21st century and promote holistic development among students. It has been met with both praise and criticism, and its successful implementation remains a significant challenge.


Navigating NEP 2020 for Enhanced Academic Excellence

Notably, he highlighted that one theory credit equates to one hour of teaching, while one practical credit corresponds to two hours of teaching. Prof. Fr. Dejus emphasized that, beyond fulfilling the minimum credit requirements, students must undertake a mandatory summer internship as part of their exit criteria at any academic level.



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

13 April - 26 May 2023




9th International Yoga Day Celebration

21 June 2023


