4. Details of the Activities organized/ Work Performed


- Use of Non-Sexist Language at the Workplace: To build proper communication one needs to make sure that the language and use of words is not flawed. Sexism has been ruling the minds and tongues of people and they often tend to forget when to say what and why is that necessary. To spread awareness about the same and inculcate this knowledge of right words in students the Women's cell collaborated with the Department of English, to organize a guest lecture on "The Use of Non-Sexist Language at the Workplace", that was delivered by Tuheena Raj, epigram blogger, writer and Tedx speaker, on 17 September 2020.
- COVID-19: Impact of Digitalization on Mental Health: Coinciding with its objective to make students aware about the impact of excessive use of the digital aids on their lifestyle and learn the simple ways to keep them mentally and physically fit in the COVID-19 situation. The webinar was organised on 18 December 2020 and was conducted by Dr. Vidhya Nair, a renowned psychologist who helped many college students resolve their stress issues because of the digital world.
- I Identify... Sharing Narratives: On 21 January 2021, Women's Cell, St. Xavier's College, Jaipur, in collaboration with Writer's Voice Society, organised "I Identify... Sharing Narratives" a poetry slam session where the participants were invited to share their poetries on themes both detailed before and those on which the participants had written their pieces. The themes for the session were "Women as Home-Makers", "Redefining Masculinity", "Womanhood is greater than Motherhood" and "Transfiguring Trans Preconceptions".
- Dear Mother, the First Woman in My Life...: The cell organised this event to celebrate International Women's Day, 8 March 2021, by expressing gratitude for the first woman in every individual's life. For this event the cell circulated a google form and everyone was invited to share their thoughts and feelings through an open letter, poem or an anonymous confession, for his/her mother.
- Whisper No More: Sanitary Napkin Donation Drive 62% of young women in the country use cloth for menstrual protection, says NFHS. Women's Cell, St Xavier's College, Jaipur stepped forward to help underprivileged young women and donate Sanitary napkins to them. The donation drive began on 1 February, 2021, with the name Whisper No More: Sanitary Napkin Donation Drive, in collaboration with Sanitation and Hygiene (SAP), St Xavier's College, Jaipur. Cartons were placed in the college campus for a month, where people could donate sanitary napkins. On 4 March 2021, the faculty and student members of the Women's Cell visited Government Senior Secondary School, Banipark, Jaipur, to donate these sanitary napkins.
