Three Days National Workshop On Intellectual Property Rights for Innovative Entrepreneurship On 26th November 2020.(In Collaboration with Dept. of Computer Science)

The workshop was organised to sensitise the students about IPR, Patents, trademarks, designs, and copyrights. The inaugural session began with the address by *Rev Fr Dr A Rex Angelo SJ*,

Principal, St. Xavier's College, Jaipur and he emphasized on the rationale importance and nature of IPR.

The workshop commenced with the presence of marvellous speakers in which around 150 participants participated. The Workshop was graced by the renowned speakers like *Dr. Bharat*

N Suryawanshi, Assistant Controller of Patents and Designs at Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Intellectual Property Management, Nagpur. He started the session with familiarising evryone with the denotation of intellectual property right and all the terms related to it. Students finally got to understand the factual meaning of Patents, trademarks, designs and copyrights. They were amazed to know how a product is protected by so many rights. Sir illuminated the process of getting patents in very convenient and manageable way. The first day of the workshop ended with a question and answer session where all the doubts of the students were cleared in the easiest way possible.


Mr. Nakul J. Sharedalal, founder NS Legal, Mentor at KCCI, Honorary Global Advisor at AACCI and CIAC described meaning of Intellectual property. Student learnt about which properties are included in IP, nature of IP etc. He also explained modes of protection of IP. He shared detailed presentation on the process of patent, trademark, GI, Copyrights etc and clarified the minute difference between these.

Another eminent speaker of the session was *Prof (Dr.) Vijay Singh Rathore*, Professor CS and Director International IIS University, Jaipur. He gave the basic idea about inventions and patent. He also thoroughly explained various benefits of IPRs. He gave real example to understand the importance of Patent and Copyright. He shared his observations on the relevance of IPR and GI for the future entrepreneurs. He explained the importance of economic analysis and its application to trademark, copyrights, patents. He stressed on the importance of innovations for economic development and the role of Intellectual property law in providing the same. The session was very interactive and students came to know many new things about patent.

Last day of the workshop had an interactive session with *Mr. Vikas Asawat*, Patent Attorney and Registered with Patent. He pragmatically explained various rules of copyright and trademark. Various symbols to indicate trademark were explained in- depth. He shared a presentation on the geographical indication and gave latest data on the status of GI in India. He concluded the talk by explaining the rationale of protection and the nature of IPR. He also emphasised that IPR have to be renewed from time to time for keeping them enforced except in case of copyright and trade secrets. Procedure and practices adopted for IPRs around the globe were also discussed by him.

All the sessions were very interactive. Students and faculties asked many questions from resource person to gain knowledge about untouched filed of IPRs. The workshop was highly informative for all the participants.






[6] Freshers' Party: The Fireside (23 November 2020) Coordinators: Dr Ranjit Kaur & Dr Shruti Rawal


1. Post pandemic challenges and opportunities for students






Anandam Day Celebration on 17th February 2021

Xavier's College Jaipur organized a virtual multidisciplinary ICSSR (Indian Council of Social Science Research, New Delhi) sponsored two-day international conference on **'Dimensions of a Pandemic: The COVID- 19 Crisis' during 11 & 12 February.** The pandemic has had far-reaching consequences beyond the spread of the disease and the efforts to contain it. To explore more of such consequences in every aspect of life and our survival, St Xavier's College organised this international conference linking academicians, industrialists, and students across the globe through online platform.

The theme and sub themes that are covered in this conference cut across boundaries and talk of an integrated approach to this global crisis to allow dialogue. The conference was inaugurated on Google Meet connecting academics, scholars, researchers, and entrepreneurs across the globe. **Rev. Fr. Varkey Perekkatt**, Manager, St. Xavier's College, Jaipur, applauded the initiative of the college in holding a conference on a current challenge that calls upon our collective will and strength as a fight back mechanism. **Rev.**

Dr. Fr. A Rex Angelo, our erudite Principal, stressed on the need of every individual turning into a Corona Warrior. By sharing the real-life story of a boy who cycled from Kerala to Kashmir selling tea during the pandemic, he highlighted how every spoke in the wheel of humanity is vital for our collective survival and how every positive stroke is valuable in dark times as these, no matter how small a ripple it may seem.

The chief guest, Dr. Nassir Nasseri, Associate Executive Dean, Computer Information Science Division, HCT, UAE, in his address appreciated the adaptability of the human spirit yet cautioned us at the same time. While laying out a roadmap for future he raised red flags to slow down our eagerness in leaving conventional and time-tested models for the more attractive and lucrative options. He insisted on maintaining a mindful balance if we are to sustain ourselves in the face of such crises.

Dr. Soma Dey, Professor, FMS, Delhi University, our Guest of Honour rightly examined the dimensions of our existence that we should let go and the aspects that we

need to retain. She also highlighted the fact that education should trickle down evenly to the lowest strata of the society because it is education alone that can act as a catalyst of change in times of great need.

There were a total of **7 technical sessions** covering an array of dimensions spread over two days. The first technical session, **The Economic Extent of The Pandemic**, was chaired by **Prof. Ajay Sharma**, Associate Professr, IIM, Indore and **Dr. Soma Dey**, while the keynote speaker, **Dr. Kartikeya Narparaju**, Associate Professor, IIM, Indore, focused on the impact of COVID-19 crisis on global economy, trade, investment and agriculture. A total of **10** papers were presented in the session on related topics.

Mr. Mahesh Narayan an experienced AI and Advanced Analytics Professional chaired the second session, **The Commercial Commencements During and Post Pandemic**, wherein **Dr. Lakshmi Subhramnyam Ladha**, who has worked in both academia and industry, in India and the USA, offered an interdisciplinary approach incorporating both theory and practice in the commercial realm. Approximately **7** well researched papers were presented in this session.

The third session focused on **Emerging Significance of Psychology in Understanding** and Addressing the Transitions Created by Covid-19 under which around 9 quality papers were presented. Dr. Uma Joshi, struck the right note with her comprehensive keynote address titled 'The Influence of Personality on the Perception of Life Events and Psychological Well-being'. The session was chaired by Dr Tim Ojo an experienced coach and mediator and Dr. Chetna Duggal is an Associate Professor in the School of Human Ecology (SHE), Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), Mumbai.

Unravelling Covid-19 Crisis: Socio-Political Implications was the last session of the first day chaired by was **Dr. Jyoti Chandel**, Head, Department of Political Science at Sophia Girl's College, Ajmer and the Keynote was delivered **by Dr. Umapathi Attikuppam**, Assistant Professor at Banaras Hindu University. The **10** papers presented provided a unique perspective to the Covid-19 crisis and its implications on various paradigms.

The second day of the conference began with a technical session **Re-Imagining the Future: Peoples' Agenda For A Post Covid Economy**. **Mr. Mahesh Narayan** struck the right chord in his keynote as he talked about migration, migrants and the challenges they have faced because of the pandemic. **12** enlightening papers were presented ranging

from right to education to migrant workers.

Another session examined the **Shifting Parameters of Literature in Pandemic** with **Prof. Nibir Ghosh,** former Head, Department of English Studies & Research, Agra College as the chair and **Prof. Kalpana Purohit,** Head, Department of English, Jai Narayan Vyas University, Jodhpur deliberating upon how literature liberates through her talk titled **The Dynamics of Literature: An insight into the reverberations of Musings.** A total of **18** papers were presented touching upon Trauma Literature, Redefining Spaces in Pandemic and Literature of Resistance.

The final session of the conference, **Widening Spectrum for Digital Word in Covid-19 Era** was chaired by Dr Ajeet Poonia, a renowned name in the field of IT and the keynote address was delivered by **Dr. Manju Kaushik** an Associate Professor, Amity University, Rajasthan. A total of **17** papers were presented in the session that highlighted the expansion of technology during and after the Pandemic.

The conference would not have been complete without a meaningful interaction of the various disciplines of learning. **The Panel Discussion** moderated by our principal, Rev. Dr. Fr. A Rex Angelo, had stalwarts like **Dr Bajrang Lal Saini**, Director, Hindi Granth Academy, **Ms Swati Vashishtha**, a Jaipur based independent journalist, and **Mr. Suraj Jajoo** an alumnus of Royal Holloway, University of London and Christ College, Bangalore who shared their perspectives on the various dimensions of the pandemic and how humanity stands united in the face of such a mammoth challenge.

A total of **70** papers were presented under various technical sessions. Overall, the conference had been beneficial as it not only widened the spectrum of knowledge and awareness about how the various facets of life were altered irrevocably by Corona but has also taught us the value of life, compassion, and the resilience of the adamantine spirit of humankind. 3. Objective:

The objective of the committee is to keep check and encourage everyone in the college campus to follow Covid-19 safety measures such as sanitization, wearing mask properly, maintaining social distancing, etc. Under the efficient support and guidance of management the committee also conducted activities to help poor and needy people who lost their jobs during this pandemic.

Measures taken to follow Covid-19 safety measures:

- The automatic sanitization machine was place at the reception area.
- Feet oriented Sanitizing Machines were installed at various places in college campus (Library, Staff Room 1 and 2, Principal Office, Entrance, Vice-Principal Office, Computer Lab, in corridors at each floor)

SAP: Swachhta Action Plan: Swachhta Action Plan is a milestone initiative in mainstreaming Swachhta elements across all sectors of the Government in an elaborate, accountable, and sustained manner to realize Gandhiji's dream of Swachh Bharat. St. Xavier's College, Jaipur also took an initiative in this regard and formulated an SAP Committee, comprising of five separate units (Sanitation and Hygiene; Waste Management; Water Management; Energy Management; Greenery).

Objective:

During the session 2020-21, keeping in mind the COVID-19 pandemic situation, the main objectives of the SAP committee were:

- Post COVID 19 Sanitation Measures
- Clean and functional toilets (365 × 24)
- Safe drinking water (365 × 24)
- Clean surroundings
- Clean building/rooms
- Planting local, resilient trees that ensure water table is not eroded.

Activities taken up by Sanitation and Hygiene Unit:

1. Installation of Contact-less Sanitizing Machines and Disinfectant Fogging Machine: Post Covid 19 Sanitation Measures.

The Sanitation and Hygiene Unit: SAP took initiative to install contactless sanitizing machines at numerous places inside and outside the campus. With the help of management disinfectant spraying machine was purchased and daily fogging of disinfectant was ensured in the entire campus. Sanitizers were distributed to the maintenance staff. The visitors body temperature was monitored on daily basis. The entire staff was requested to take relevant precautionary measures.

Under this activity one automatic sanitizer machine was installed at the entrance and 12 pedal sanitizer machines were installed at various places like outside principal office, library, staff rooms etc.

2. Webinar on "Beware but don't be scared: Covid-19: Precautions we can take": Post Covid 19 Sanitation Measures.

A webinar on "Beware but don't be scared: Covid-19: Precautions we can take" was organized on 27th August 2020 in collaboration with the Dept. of Economics. The targeted audience for this lecture were college staff, students, parents, and it was also made open for public. The main highlights of the webinar were: Coronavirus, its symptoms, prevention, treatment, myth busters, precautions: advice for public and educational institutions. The lecture was delivered by Dr. Sheetu Singh, MD (Respiratory Medicine), Associate Professor, IRD, SMS Medical College and Hospital, Jaipur and Dr. Ashu Agarwal, Assistant Professor, SMS Medical College and Hospital Jaipur.

3. Two-day workshop on "Life Skills: Yoga, Physical Fitness, Health and Hygiene": Hygiene and Safety.

A two-day workshop was organized on "Life Skills: Yoga, Physical Fitness, Health and Hygiene" during 23-24 September 2020, in collaboration with LSEC and Dept. of Computer Science. Under this a separate session was dedicated on *Self Safety and Hygiene*. The targeted audience for this programme was students and more than 110 students participated in this workshop.

4. Whisper No More: Sanitation Napkin Donation Drive and Awareness Programme: Hygiene and Safety.

A Sanitation Napkin Donation Drive was organized on 4th March 2021 in collaboration with Women's Cell and Dept. of English. Under this drive sanitation napkins were distributed in Govt. Girls School, Labour Colony, Jaipur. The main aim of this programme was to spread awareness amongst the young girls regarding self-hygiene and safety.

Note: In addition to these proper sanitation and hygiene measures were taken in the campus, including keeping the surroundings clean, ensuring cleanliness and hygiene in toilets, and availability of safe drinking water. Proper quarantine measures were also taken whenever required by the entire staff of the college with the help of management.




Disinfectant Spraying in the Campus






Monitoring Body Temperature




Xavier's College Alumni (XCA)


6. Free Online Counselling Facility






7. Covid Counselling: A Session on Mental and Medical Health

- c. Conducting Student research-oriented Presentations/workshop/seminar


4. Details of the Activities organized/ Work Performed

- A) Orientation Xavier's Research Project Committee of St. Xavier's College, Jaipur, organized an Orientation Program on 13th Oct 2020 to steer and guide the students towards research based activities in the college. The program was graced by the presence of Fr. Rex Angelo, Principal St. Xavier's College, Jaipur. Fr. Principal motivated the students to engage themselves in meaningful research and highlighted the importance of early induction into research in this competitive global scenario. Jaya Katta (BBA Batch 2016-18) and Lukansha Gopalan (MA Eco Hons Batch 2018-19) and Shantanu Sharma(BA Eco Hons Batch 2019) as member of Xavier's Research Projects cell shared their experiences of research and inspired the students to engage in the field of research. Current students of different department (Manvi Agarwal (BBA III year, Mohit Singh Sisodia, BBA II) as young researchers shared their experiences with the new entrants, inspiring them to join this novel enterprise by the college. An overview of the previous session's activities along with the overview of upcoming activities planned by Research Project Cell was presented by the Coordinator, Dr. Leena Sharma Session was moderated by Mr. Yashwardhan Singh, Assistant Coordinator of XRPC.
- B) This year due to Covid-19 Pandemic, XRPC planned to publish a special issue of Research
 Project Book (with ISBN number) on theme: Impact of Covid-19 with subthemes on

management, commerce, IT, economics, psychology, politics and literature. Research projects are being prepared by student of different departments based on online /telephonic survey format inspite of pandemic situation in the session. XRPC also started its research on major project on *Impact of Covid-19 on Livelihood of Vulnerable section of Society*

- C) Xavier's Research Project Cell has collaborated with Department of Computer Science for the conduct of short-term training program (STTP) on Data Science using R Programming from 26th-31st October 2020 in collaboration under aegis of IQAC on virtual platform. Dr. Brijesh Awasthi, Adjunct Professor (Data Analytics and Research) Poornima University, Jaipur, Rajasthan, and Adjunct Professor (Data Analytics) Jaipuria Institute of Management, Jaipur was the resource person. The STTP was joined by around 31 students and 5 teachers .The STTP started with basic knowledge understanding of statistical data with the help of interesting examples and the crucial role of statistical analysis in the field of research and development.
- D) XRPC has collaborated with Department of Business Administration for the conduct of Research Methodology workshop .The 3- day National Workshop on "The Art of Writing Research Papers". Workshop began with the blessings and encouragement of Rev. Fr. Dr. A. Rex Angelo S.J, Principal who motivated the young researchers by emphasizing on the significance of learning the art as well as the science of writing good research papers, dissertations and thesis. The three different days of the workshop were curated by three different and eminent resource persons. On the first day, Dr. Meenal Agarwal, an academician at DAVV Indore University started with the basics of research and shared her ideas on the "Introduction to Research Paper and How to Write Research Paper". Day 2 began with the enlightening session by the renowned Professor, Dr. Manvinder Singh Pahwa, Professor, Department of Business Administration at School of Business and Commerce at Manipal University, Jaipur, who gave a detailed insight on "Qualitative and Quantitative Research Tools". The third day focussed on the ethical concerns and focussed on plagiarism which was discussed by Prof. Anil Mehta, Professor, Department of Legal Studies, Banasthali Vidhyapeeth, who gave his presentation on "How to Write Bibliography and Referencing in Research Papers".


