4. Details of the Activities organized/ Work Performed (Not more than 500 -700 words)

- 1) Beware but don't be Scared: COVID-19 A Webinar on the precautionary steps to be taken to combat COVID-19 was hosted on 27 August 2020, by the Swachhta Action Plan Committee (Sanitisation & Hygiene) and the Department of Economics of St Xavier's College, Jaipur. The aim of the Webinar was to assist the group in dealing with the problems caused by the Corona virus's rapid spread. Dr. Ashu Agarwal and Dr. Shetu Singh from SMS Medical College outlined a clear-cut management plan that could hold the infection at bay.
- 2) An informative webinar on "Introduction to data science: A roadmap to future prediction" was also organized by the department on 28th November 2020. Mr. Shubham Saxena an alumni student of the St. Xavier's College, Jaipur who is currently working as an Analytics Advisory (Data Sciences) at Think analytics Pvt. Ltd., Mumbai was invited as the resource person. The detailed discussion on the topic included the explanation of what entails the field of data sciences, how it is useful, where it is used, and what are the different career options to be explored as a data scientist.

3) Economics Lecture Series

The Department initiated Economics Lecture Series to impart better and practical knowledge of the theoretical concepts as studied in the classroom. The Department of Economics and Psychology at St. Xavier's College, Jaipur organized along with the Meghnad Desai Academy of Economics (MDAE) held the first webinar in its Economics Lecture Series on 16th October, 2020 on the topic India's Middle Class -How Many are They, Who are They? The Guest Speaker was Prof. Sandhya Krishnan, who holds a Ph.D from the University of Amsterdam and is currently an assistant professor at MDAE. The Department also organized the second lecture on "Cost of COVID Treatment in India: Who bears the Burden" on the 3rd of November. The resource persons for this lecture were Dr. Saktivel Selvaraj currently at Public Health Foundation of India (PHFI), New Delhi and Prof. Indrani Gupta currently at Institute of Economic Growth, New Delhi. On 6 January 2021, the Department of Economics and Psychology hosted its final webinar in the Lecture Series on the topic Unemployment in the Times of Covid 19: Challenges and Solutions. Dr. Ashish Kulkarni, Assistant Professor, Gokhle Institute of Politics and Economics, the Resource Person, used diagrams to clarify the present unemployment situation, highlighting the various facets of unemployment and potential solutions to alleviate it.

4) Mental Health Drive

a. Activity 1: Webinar on Living in the times of Pandemic- Psychological Impact of Lockdown and Self Isolation

On **September 19, 2020**, the Department of Psychology organised a webinar titled "**Living in Pandemic Times: Psychological Impact of Lockdown and Self Isolation**," with the aim of understanding the need to speak up and discuss mental health during pandemics. **Ms. Mimansa Singh Tanwar**, Lead Clinical Psychologist and Programme Head- Clinical Psychology and Mental Health, Fortis Healthcare, Gurugram, was the resource person for this webinar. Students and faculty members from all the departments of the institution were invited to

attend the webinar. One of the main topics addressed in the webinar was the need to unmute ourselves and start talking about mental health issues, as this would not only help to break down the stigma associated with mental health issues, but will also allow people to speak and express their feelings and feelings without feeling embarrassed. Ms. Mimansa expressed her insights about how one should participate in positive tasks during the lockout time to help counteract depressive thoughts and thereby improve one's quality of life. During the webinar, a short question and answer session was also conducted so that students could ask all of their questions and get expert advice. Students actively participated in this webinar, sharing their experiences and inquiring about the recommendations for identifying destructive thinking processes and coping mechanisms for continuing stress.

b. Activity 2: Interactive Webinar on "Mental Health for All"

On 9th October 2020, to mark World Mental Health Day and promote mental health and wellbeing in students and faculty members, an interactive webinar "Mental Health for All" was organized. The webinar was conducted by the eminent clinical psychologist, Ms. Pradnya Deshpande, a mental health professional with 20 years of work experience and a member of Prevention of Sexual Harassment at Work Place (POSH) Committee, SMS Psychiatric Centre. The primary target audience for the session was predominantly students and this session invited students to submit the emotional problems faced by them anonymously and gave them a forum to discuss these problems with a mental health professional and encourage different perspectives of understanding the problem and brainstorm possible solutions. More than 100 students submitted the issues faced by them anonymously and some of the common problems discussed in the session included lack of anger management, issues with generation gap between the youth and the parents, relationship and family concerns as well as issues of insecurity, body image and lack of body positivity as well as negative emotions being experienced due to the ongoing pandemic. Through this session, students learned the identification of negative and unhelpful thought patterns, coping strategies for restructuring these patterns as well as enhancing the quality of life and mental health by engaging in meaningful hobbies and pleasurable interests.

c. Activity 3: Movie Screening and Essay Writing Competition

The first online movie screening on **28th October 2020** was of the movie "**The Social Dilemma**" which explores how the Internet's most popular products (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram etc.) work on a basic business model of tracking users' behavior in order to sell ads and induce addiction in a vicious cycle. The session took off with a brief introduction and shortly after that the screening began. The film runs 1 hour and 34 minutes. It was attended by over 60 students along with the faculty. It was an eye-opening, educational, foreboding yet insightful session and it explained the polarization, the addiction, the loneliness we are seeing in society. The screening was followed by an Essay writing competition, the given topic was WHAT IS MORE IMPORTANT: CONNECTIVITY OR FREEDOM? Three winners were declared for this competition namely Kanvika Sharma, Pallavi Chattopadhyay and Pavitra Arora.

d. Activity 4: Webinar on "Self Awareness: Knowing Yourself"

The third mental health drive was organized on 6th November 2020 on "Self Awareness: Knowing Yourself" with the objective of raising awareness within our community about the importance of being self-aware and its effect on our mental health. The resource person of the webinar was Dr. Sudhesh N.T. He is currently working as an Assistant Professor of Psychology at Christ University, Bangalore. He is also an editor and has published numerous articles in various international and national journals. He has also worked in GFATM (Global Fund for AIDS, Tuberculosis & Malaria) project under MG University, Kerala. He is the President of IALSE (Indian Association of Life Skills Education) Bangalore, Karnataka and the coordinator of Project Spandan. Through this webinar, students were helped to identify their beliefs, values, and motivators in relation to others, also their primary stressors and how they reacted to them. Dr. Sudhesh N.T. highlighted how students could use SWOT analysis in their personal lives in intrinsic detail. For future sessions, students should be encouraged to keep participating throughout the webinar in the ongoing activities being facilitated by the resource person to ensure better understanding of the concepts and their application in real life situations.

e. Activity 6: Webinar on "Connection between the Body and Mind"

The Department of Psychology at St. Xavier's College, Jaipur, hosted its fourth webinar on the subject "Connection between the Body and Mind" as part of the Mental Health Drive. This immersive session took place on the **16th of February** 2021 via Google Meet, an online forum. Dr. Raghav Shah, Consultant and Director, Departm ent of Psychiatry and De-Addiction, Rajasthan Hospital, Jaipur, was the event's guest speaker. Dr. Shah has the distinction of being Rajasthan's first super-specialist in Psychiatry Medicine. Students and faculty members from all the departments of the institution were invited to attend the webinar. In a comprehensive PowerPoint presentation, Dr. Shah discussed the close link between the body and the mind. He described the mind-body association, as well as its physical and psychological dimensions. Dr. Shah's presentation was accompanied by a short question and answer session, which provided students and faculty members with an opportunity to hear from an expert on a variety of social problems they face, as well as coping mechanisms for dealing with stress in daily life. Dr. Shah shared guidelines for stress control and breaking the cycle of maladaptive behaviors based on his own experience. The students were fully engaged in the webinar, giving the department another feather of achievement in its cap.

5) Donation Drive: Ek Abhilasha: An Efforts Towards Making Dreams Come True
On 22 and 23 November 2020, the Economics Society of St. Xavier's College, Jaipur arranged a Donation Drive titled "Ek Abhilasha- An Effort to Make Dreams Come True" in honor of Late Dr. Sapna Newar and her family. Winter clothes, toiletries, groceries, and stationery were donated during the Drive at Mother Teresa Home, C-Scheme and SOS Children's Village, Shastri Nagar. Dr. Sapna Newar was a keen supporter of both of these NGOs and their goal of assisting, enriching, and uplifting the

6) Dr. Sapna Newar Memorial Lecture

The St. Xavier's College Economics Society (EcoSoc) hosted the Second Memorial Lecture on the subject "Genesis and Consequences of Recent Farm Acts" on 14 **December 2020**, as part of the Dr. Sapna Newar Memorial Lecture Series. The lecture was delivered by **Prof. R.S. Deshpande** (Former Director, Institute for Social and Economic Change (ISEC), Bangalore). He thoroughly described the three bills passed by the Indian Parliament, highlighting the major problems of all three bills affecting the Indian economy.

7) Dr. Sapna Newar Library

In the honour of beloved professor, Lt. Dr. Sapna Newar, the Department of Economics and Psychology has developed a department library- Dr. Sapna Newar Library. It has been established with the aim of providing a forum for information exchange and expanding the amount of reference material accessible to current and former students of the Department. The Inauguration Ceremony was organised on **9 January 2021** with the blessings of Rev. Fr. Verkey Perekkatt and Rev. Fr. Dr. A. Rex Angelo.

8) National Symposium

The Annual National Symposium was virtually organized on 15 January 2021 by the Department of Economics and Psychology. "Looking through Intermediate Lenses: Inclusive and Green Growth" was the theme of this year's Symposium. Dr. Aditi Sawant (Head, Economics Department, St. Xavier's College, Mumbai) delivered the event's keynote address. Dr. Sawant discussed the importance of the private sector and government working together to meet inclusive growth targets, as well as the prospects for creating an inclusive India by identifying key levers in education, governance, and economic development.

9) Synergy'21- Virtualization of Ideas

On January 16 and 17, 2021, the Department of Economics and Psychology hosted its annual festival, 'Synergy.' Synergy's ninth edition lived up to its reputation, with the theme of 'Virtualization of Ideas' that was appropriately chosen keeping the current scenario in mind. This year, more than 250 students from colleges across the country, including Lady Sri Ram College for Women, HR College Churchgate, Christ University, IIT Kharagpur, Nirma University, Mithibai College, NMIMS, and St Xavier's College Ahmedabad, to name a few, virtually participated in this festival celebrating Economics and Psychology. The Chief Guest of the event, Mr. Om Thanvi (Vice Chancellor, Haridev Joshi University of Journalism and Mass Communication, Rajasthan ILD Skills University, and Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University, Ajmer) illuminated the audience about the importance of Indian values and traditions. This year's conclave theme was 'Vocal for Local.' Mrs Manisha Jani (Director and Cofounder, Indigreenz, Innovation, Pvt. Ltd.), Mrs Saloni Sacheti (Founder, Baansuli), and Mr Manan Issar (CEO and Founder, Piltover Technologies, Pvt. Ltd.) were among the panellists for the discussion that emphasized the relevance of manufacturing and purchasing local goods to boost the Indian economy. Bid for Bait, Pandanomy, State of the Nation, Devil's Advocate, Inquesta, Cyber Hunt, Press Search, Restructuring the Precedent, Virtual Warriors, and Cyber Hunt were among the 9 activities that took place over the span of two days. The results were revealed during the valedictory session, with St. Xavier's Ahmedabad emerging as the festival's overall winner.

10) Research Workshop

To develop knowledge and essential skills required for writing a research paper, the Department of Economics and Psychology hosted a two-day Research Methodology Workshop on the **8 and 9 February 2021**. **Dr. Preeti Bhatt** (Associate Professor, MNIT, Jaipur) and **Dr. Bhawana Arya** (Associate Professor, Manipal University, Jaipur) led four technical sessions during the workshop.

11) Movie Screenings and Essay/Review Writing

Learning from various mediums of expressions has been an integral part of education. With this understanding, the Department of Economics and Psychology organised virtual movie screenings this year to screen movies and promote learning through interaction and discussion. The first online movie screening on 28th November 2020 was of the movie "The Social Dilemma" which explores how the Internet's most popular products (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram etc.) work on a basic business model of tracking users' behavior in order to sell ads and induce addiction in a vicious cycle. The screening was followed by an Essay writing competition, the given topic was WHAT IS MORE IMPORTANT: CONNECTIVITY OR FREEDOM? Three winners were declared for this competition namely Kanvika Sharma, Pallavi Chattopadhyay and Pavitra Arora. The second movie to be screened was "A Beautiful Mind" on 19th December 2020, that entails the story of a psychologically ill mathematician John Nash and the difficulties he faced in his life until the time he was awarded the Nobel Prize. The movie helped the students understand the various aspects of living with a serious mental illness - how love can conquer delusions, how genius and schizophrenia can coexist in the same individual. The movie screening was followed by a movie review competition which was to be submitted by 23rd December, 2020. Nihar Vyas was adjudged the winner of the movie review competition.


12) Alumni Interaction Sessions




b. Lecture 2: Cost of COVID Treatment in India: Who bears the Burden?





2nd Dr. Sapna Newar Memorial Lecture on Genesis and Implications of Recent farm Acts

St. Xavier's College, Jaipur organized second 'Dr. Sapna **Newar Memorial** Lecture'

14 December 2020, The Economics Society of St. Xavier's College, Jaipur organized second 'Dr. Sapna Newar Memorial Lecture' on her birth anniversary December 14, Dr. Sapna Newar, former Head, Economics Department, had an exemplary academic and research profile with teaching experience of more than 12 years. She was keenly interested in Agricultural Economicsand hence to pay tribute to a dignified and noble professor, the topic of this lecture was selected as 'Genesis and implications of Recent Farm Acts' The lecture was delivered by Prof. R.S. Deshpande, Former Director, Institute for Social and Economic Change (ISEC), Bangalore. Rev. Dr. A. Rex Angelo, Principle, formally welcomed the guest speaker and asserted that the reforms linked to these bills will offer revolutionary changes in the set framework of farming in India. Prof. Deshpande decoded the three bills- Farmers' Produce Trade and Commerce (Promotion and Facilitation) Act, 2020, Farmers (Empowerment and Protection) Agreement of Price Assurance, Farm Services Act, 2020, and the Essential Commodities (Amendment) Act, 2020 passed by Indian Parliament in detail and highlighted the key concerns associated with all three bills on Indian Economy . He also emphasized upon the reason for farmers'agitation over these bills and resolution strategies. He further added that





the farmer would now be not bound to trade in the APMC yard alone and the controls of the brokers, agents or traders in the form of money lenders would be relaxed. The Lecture was attended by over 200 participants including college management members, professors, eminent scholars, and students from different institutions.

The memorial lecture was then followed by the second Alumni Meet where the students from eight (2013-2020) previous batches enthusiastically participated, shared their experiences being a Xavierite and the and interacted with the current batch students about their journey after college.

National Symposium on Looking Through Intermediate Lenses:Inclusive and Green Growth

The department's list of offerings continues to expand, with guest lectures on behavioral health and psychology, bridge and certificate courses, internships, various research opportunities, and online immersive learning to name a few. Students of the department are motivated to engage in study and scholarly writing, as well as to develop their decision-making abilities in varied situations.

 - b. Spread awareness about various pertinent mental health issues

- **4. Details of the Activities organized/ Work Performed** (*Not more than 500 -700 words*)
 - 1. Mental Health Drive Activity 1: Webinar on Living in the times of Pandemic-Psychological Impact of Lockdown and Self Isolation
 - On **September 19, 2020**, the Department of Psychology organised a webinar titled "**Living in Pandemic Times: Psychological Impact of Lockdown and Self Isolation**," with the aim of understanding the need to speak up and discuss mental health during pandemics. **Ms. Mimansa Singh Tanwar**, Lead Clinical Psychologist and Programme Head- Clinical Psychology and Mental Health, Fortis Healthcare, Gurugram, was the resource person for this webinar. Students and faculty members

from all the departments of the institution were invited to attend the webinar. One of the main topics addressed in the webinar was the need to unmute ourselves and start talking about mental health issues, as this would not only help to break down the stigma associated with mental health issues, but will also allow people to speak and express their feelings and feelings without feeling embarrassed. Ms. Mimansa expressed her insights about how one should participate in positive tasks during the lockout time to help counteract depressive thoughts and thereby improve one's quality of life. During the webinar, a short question and answer session was also conducted so that students could ask all of their questions and get expert advice. Students actively participated in this webinar, sharing their experiences and inquiring about the recommendations for identifying destructive thinking processes and coping mechanisms for continuing stress.

2. Mental Health Drive Activity 2: Interactive Webinar on "Mental Health for All" On 9th October 2020, to mark World Mental Health Day and promote mental health and wellbeing in students and faculty members, an interactive webinar "Mental Health for All' was organized. The webinar was conducted by the eminent clinical psychologist, Ms. Pradnya Deshpande, a mental health professional with 20 years of work experience and a member of Prevention of Sexual Harassment at Work Place (POSH) Committee, SMS Psychiatric Centre. The primary target audience for the session was predominantly students and this session invited students to submit the emotional problems faced by them anonymously and gave them a forum to discuss these problems with a mental health professional and encourage different perspectives of understanding the problem and brainstorm possible solutions. More than 100 students submitted the issues faced by them anonymously and some of the common problems discussed in the session included lack of anger management, issues with generation gap between the youth and the parents, relationship and family concerns as well as issues of insecurity, body image and lack of body positivity as well as negative emotions being experienced due to the ongoing pandemic. Through this session, students learned the identification of negative and unhelpful thought patterns, coping strategies for restructuring these patterns as well as enhancing the quality of life and mental health by engaging in meaningful hobbies and pleasurable interests.

3. Mental Health Drive Activity 3: Movie Screening and Essay Writing Competition

The first online movie screening on **28th October 2020** was of the movie "The **Social Dilemma**" which explores how the Internet's most popular products (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram etc.) work on a basic business model of tracking users' behavior in order to sell ads and induce addiction in a vicious cycle. The session took off with a brief introduction and shortly after that the screening began. The film runs 1 hour and 34 minutes. It was attended by over 60 students along with the faculty. It was an eye-opening, educational, foreboding yet insightful session and it explained the polarization, the addiction, the loneliness we are seeing in society. The screening was followed by an Essay writing competition, the given topic was WHAT IS MORE IMPORTANT: CONNECTIVITY OR FREEDOM? Three winners were declared for this competition namely Kanvika Sharma, Pallavi Chattopadhyay and Pavitra Arora.

4. Mental Health Drive Activity 4: Webinar on "Self Awareness: Knowing Yourself"

The third mental health drive was organized on 6th November 2020 on "Self Awareness: Knowing Yourself" with the objective of raising awareness within our community about the importance of being self-aware and its effect on our mental health. The resource person of the webinar was **Dr. Sudhesh N.T**. He is currently working as an Assistant Professor of Psychology at Christ University, Bangalore. He is also an editor and has published numerous articles in various international and national journals. He has also worked in GFATM (Global Fund for AIDS, Tuberculosis & Malaria) project under MG University, Kerala. He is the President of IALSE (Indian Association of Life Skills Education) Bangalore, Karnataka and the coordinator of Project Spandan. Through this webinar, students were helped to identify their beliefs, values, and motivators in relation to others, also their primary stressors and how they reacted to them. Dr. Sudhesh N.T. highlighted how students could use SWOT analysis in their personal lives in intrinsic detail. For future sessions, students should be encouraged to keep participating throughout the webinar in the ongoing activities being facilitated by the resource person to ensure better understanding of the concepts and their application in real life situations.

5. Mental Health Drive Activity 5: Movie Screening and Review Writing Competition

19th December 2020, that entails the story of a psychologically ill mathematician John Nash and the difficulties he faced in his life until the time he was awarded the Nobel Prize. The session took off with a brief introduction and shortly after that the screening began. The movie was around 2 hours long. It was attended by over 50 students along with the faculty members. The movie helped the students understand the various aspects of living with a serious mental illness - how love can conquer delusions, how genius and schizophrenia can co-exist in the same individual. The movie screening was followed by a movie review competition which was to be submitted by 23rd December, 2020. Nihar Vyas was adjudged the winner of the movie review competition.

6. Mental Health Drive Activity 6: Webinar on "Connection between the Body and Mind"

The Department of Psychology at St. Xavier's College, Jaipur, hosted its fourth webinar on the subject "Connection between the Body and Mind" as part of the Mental Health Drive. This immersive session took place on the 16th of February 2021 via Google Meet, an online forum. Dr. Raghav Shah, Consultant and Director, Departm ent of Psychiatry and De-Addiction, Rajasthan Hospital, Jaipur, was the event's guest speaker. Dr. Shah has the distinction of being Rajasthan's first superspecialist in Psychiatry Medicine. Students and faculty members from all the departments of the institution were invited to attend the webinar. In a comprehensive PowerPoint presentation, Dr. Shah discussed the close link between the body and the

mind. He described the mind-body association, as well as its physical and psychological dimensions. Dr. Shah's presentation was accompanied by a short question and answer session, which provided students and faculty members with an opportunity to hear from an expert on a variety of social problems they face, as well as coping mechanisms for dealing with stress in daily life. Dr. Shah shared guidelines for stress control and breaking the cycle of maladaptive behaviors based on his own experience. The students were fully engaged in the webinar, giving the department another feather of achievement in its cap.

7. National Symposium

The Annual National Symposium was virtually organized on **15 January 2021** by the Department of Economics and Psychology. "Looking through Intermediate Lenses: Inclusive and Green Growth" was the theme of this year's Symposium. **Dr. Aditi Sawant** (Head, Economics Department, St. Xavier's College, Mumbai) delivered the event's keynote address. Dr. Sawant discussed the importance of the private sector and government working together to meet inclusive growth targets, as well as the prospects for creating an inclusive India by identifying key levers in education, governance, and economic development.

8. Synergy'21- Virtualization of Ideas

On January 16 and 17, 2021, the Department of Economics and Psychology hosted its annual festival, 'Synergy.' Synergy's ninth edition lived up to its reputation, with the theme of 'Virtualization of Ideas' that was appropriately chosen keeping the current scenario in mind. This year, more than 250 students from colleges across the country, including Lady Sri Ram College for Women, HR College Churchgate, Christ University, IIT Kharagpur, Nirma University, Mithibai College, NMIMS, and St Xavier's College Ahmedabad, to name a few, virtually participated in this festival celebrating Economics and Psychology. The Chief Guest of the event, Mr. Om Thanvi (Vice Chancellor, Haridev Joshi University of Journalism and Mass Communication, Rajasthan ILD Skills University, and Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati University, Ajmer) illuminated the audience about the importance of Indian values and traditions. This year's conclave theme was 'Vocal for Local.' Mrs Manisha Jani (Director and Co-founder, Indigreenz, Innovation, Pvt. Ltd.), Mrs Saloni Sacheti (Founder, Baansuli), and Mr Manan Issar (CEO and Founder, Piltover Technologies, Pvt. Ltd.) were among the panellists for the discussion that emphasized the relevance of manufacturing and purchasing local goods to boost the Indian economy. Bid for Bait, Pandanomy, State of the Nation, Devil's Advocate, Inquesta, Cyber Hunt, Press Search, Restructuring the Precedent, Virtual Warriors, and Cyber Hunt were among the 9 activities that took place over the span of two days. The results were revealed during the valedictory session, with St. Xavier's Ahmedabad emerged as the festival's overall winner.

9. Research Workshop




MNIT, Jaipur) and **Dr. Bhawana Arya** (Associate Professor, Manipal University, Jaipur) led four technical sessions during the workshop.

2. National Webinar on Blogging for Professional Presence: Content, Structure, and Technique – Co-Ordiantor Dr Ranjit Kaur



The webinar received an overwhelming response with around 250 participants registering for it and nearly 180 participants attending it through google meet. Her rich experience as a blogger was reflected in the webinar. 
The webinar began with an introduction to blogging, its definition and development over time. Ms. Rai effectively shared the basic components of the webinar, its structure and appearance. According to the suggestions given in the feedback, the participants felt that the hands-on practice though was done during the sessions was not enough and more time could be spent on it next time.











3. Writing Research Papers: Coordinator – Dr Rama Hirawat

A Two-day Lecture was organized by the Department of English of St. Xavier's College, Jaipur on "Writing Research Papers" on 7 and 8 September 2020. The Resource person for the lecture series was **Prof. Rajul Bhargava**, Former Head, Department of English, University of Rajasthan, Jaipur. Prof Bhargava introduced the students to the art of writing research papers. She elaborated on the evolution and significance of research in contemporary times. She emphasized on the structure of the paper, the art of framing an apt title, writing abstract and selecting an appropriate theoretical framework while writing a research paper. The second day of the lecture focused on the citations and use of MLA 8th Edition. Prof. Bhargava discussed in detail how it deviates from the earlier editions and discussed the format for citations with relevant examples. The session ended with a Q & A session where the students and faculty members deliberated on issues related to the use of theories, structure of the paper and citations. A more detailed webinar or a workshop was suggested in the feedback thus received tat would go into greater detail covering the fine nuances of writing Research Papers.









4. "Paed, Ek Naya Dost" Plantation Drive Report

5. Department Orientation: Coordinator – Dr Rama Hirawat



6. Guest Lecture in collaboration with Women's Cell on Non-Sexist Language in *Classrooms and Workplaces* – Coordinator Dr Rama Hirawat

Language is the first important tool of communication. To build proper communication one needs to make sure that the language and use of words is not flawed. Sexism has been ruling the minds and tongues of people and they often tend to forget when to say what and why is that necessary. To spread awareness about the same and inculcate this knowledge of right words in students the Women's cell collaborated with the department of English, to organize a guest lecture on "The Use of Non-Sexist Language at the Workplace". Tuheena Raj, epigram blogger, writer and Tedx speaker delivered a lecture over the same. Ms Raj talked about the use of proper pronouns, importance of respecting others, their physical and intellectual being

and many other things that we fail to notice and learn. It was an important session to give a break to the happenings around and make a change. The session was followed by questions and views put by students and teachers about how patriarchy, its symbols and supporters take over our ability to judge and the need to stop it in the easiest and polite manner possible without hurting the sentiments of others we address to. The event ended with a vote of thanks to the organizers and the speaker and received a wonderful, positive feedback from the attendees. In fact, the students preferred to have similar sessions in the future as well.





7. Bridge Course and Series of Expert Lectures on *History of English Literature*: Coordinator – Dr Rama Hirawat

The Bridge is meant to help bridge the knowledge-gap specially for students who enrol for Bachelor's or Master's in English without a background in Literature in their class XII or Under graduation. The course was organized from 15 September to 30 September 2020 by the teachers of the department. But a few sessions for a comprehensive view were also taken by Ms Unnati Jain, as part of Alumni Interaction. This series of online Guest Lectures as a part of the Bridge Course and Alumni Interaction from 21 September to 30 September. The series consisted of four lectures on the 'Brief History of English Literature' which was attended by the students of B.A. (Hons.) Part I and M.A. (English) – Previous and other interested students of the department. The resource person for the sessions was Ms Unnati Jain, Research Scholar, MNIT who is also a proud alumnus of St. Xavier's College, Jaipur. The presentations focused on the different ages in the history of English Literature, focusing on the features, chronology, the literary trends, social and political changes along with prominent authors of the era and their style. The presentations were informative and engaging as they helped the students in understanding the different ages and their significance. The purpose of the lectures was to create a better understanding in terms of the shaping of English literature down the ages up to the present times, knowledge that is pivotal to the subject. The students found the sessions informative but fast paced.







8. Gandhi Jayanti – Celebrating the Mahatma: Coordinator – Dr Ranjit Kaur The department of English, St. Xavier's College, Jaipur celebrated Gandhi and Lal Bahadur Shastri Jayanti and International Day of Non-violence through an online event 'Remembrances: A Lens to our Past' on 02 October 2020. The audience, led by our Principal, took the Swachhta Pledge, as part of our commitment to keep our surroundings clean and healthy. A Virtual Visit of Sabarmati Ashram was the highlight of the day as it provided greater insight and a richer experience to the audience. Syaahi: The seventh edition of INKA began with Pre INKA like every year but made a difference by organizing a donation drive in the name "Syaahi", shaped by team INKA in collaboration with their Social Initiative Partner – All About Happiness. The team believed in the thought "No one can help everyone, but everyone can help someone." Syaahi was a humble endeavour to provide recycled stationery to the less privileged students who aspire to do a lot but lack resources. This included old pen and pencils, notebooks, half-filled notebooks, course books, writing books and others. Moreover, it aimed to encourage students of the college to reuse and recycle little things to make a bigger difference and save mother Earth in their little ways, individually yet together. The students said, that this initiative could also include extra gadgets that people discard only because they have a new one like cell phones, earphones or headphones, etc.

The Department of English, St. Xavier's College, Jaipur, organised 'Perceptions' – a Power Point Presentation Competition for the students of Undergraduate and Postgraduate students of Literature on 5 November 2020 at 9:30 a.m. The PPT Competition was organised to initiate the students into research and presentation of research findings owing to the rampant use of online platform. A number of students participated in this competition with a lot of enthusiasm and the PPTs ranged from the topics 'Gender Neutral Mudras to combat patriarchy', 'Homosexuality and Homophobia' and they also touched upon the books like The Color Purple, The Namesake, The Forest of Enchantments, Pride and Prejudice, The Kite Runner to name a few. The students explored the various dimensions of gender roles, misperceptions, prejudice and different cultures. The event was a great success.









12. Movie Screening followed by Group Discussion and Movie Review: Coordinator – Ms Banhisikha Das

The Department of English, St. Xavier's College, Jaipur organised a screening of the movie 'Little Women' (2019) on 20 November 2020. The film screened is the most recent cinematic reiteration of Louisa May Alcott's book with the same title directed by Greta Gerwig. The screening began at 9 am and was followed by a group discussion which aimed to focus on 'women's struggle between familial duty and personal growth during the 19th century.' The discussion encompassed active participation from teachers, undergraduate students, and postgraduate students. Keeping the women's struggle—the central theme of the movie—as the focus of the discussion, participants further delved into various aspects that influence or come to define such gender issues. From feminism to postcolonialism and postmodernism, no stone

was left unturned in discussing the nuances and interpretation of the movie. The discussion focused on marriage as an institution, and in doing so, examined other institutions like religion. How tyrannical powers weaponise such institutions was one of the main focuses of the discussion. The discussion veered into probing the freedom to dream; this further elicited responses regarding the fabric of society and its scaffolds on individual choices. Participants also debated over the tussle between artistic freedom and historical accuracy. They also discussed how a non-linear narrative affixes the past to the present. Insidious gender biases and the importance of language in creating such preconceptions shaped the later course of the discussion. Participants also discussed marriage as a virtue, marriage as a choice, marriage and personal freedom, the problem of ever-increasing materialism, and the importance of monogamy and its role in raising children. The discussion ended with participants expounding on the relevance of canonical texts like 'Little Women' in today's society; and how such relevance is a testament to the current scenario and the overall progress and shortcomings of humanity. The students felt that the movie screening would have been better had it not been online. But given the circumstances they appreciated the effort and suggested more of such screenings of adaptations based on good books as the visual medium has greater mass appeal. Some students also felt that such screening should be open for students from other departments who enjoy reading as a hobby.









13. National Symposium on Changing Dimensions of Literature: From Real to Reel to Digital: Coordinators – Dr Rama Hirawat and Ms Banshisikha Das

A National Symposium on "Changing Dimensions of Literature: From Real to Reel to Digital" was organised by the Department of English, St. Xavier's College, Jaipur on 27 November 2020. The symposium was attended by eminent academicians, researchers, faculty members and students from reputed educational institutions from different parts of the country. The keynote speaker for the event was Prof. Sudha Rai, Former Head and Dean, Department of English, University of Rajasthan. Prof. Rai deliberated on the changes, causes, movements and different platforms that have enriched literature and made it more inclusive. The presentations included areas like Graphic Novels, Spoken Word Poetry, Myth-making in Fan Fiction and Digital Media in the present times. The symposium enabled meaningful discussion and exchange of ideas amongst students, scholars, and faculties. The students found the symposium highly informative but wished more time would have been given. The organisers also felt that due to paucity of time, they could not reach as many scholars outside the institution as they had wanted to. Advanced planning well ahead in time for the next session was advised by them.






15. MoC Club Auditions: Coordinator - Dr Shruti Rawal




16. National Level Story Telling Contest: Coordinator Dr Ranjit Kaur

The interaction with Ms. Castellas proved to be a blessing for the students to have an accomplished senior to guide them through the right pathway and help them to do great in their respective choices. 20. Whisper No More: Sanitary Napkin Donation Drive in collaboration with Women's Cell and SAP- Sanitation and Hygiene: Coordinator – Dr Rama Hirawat 62% of young women in the country use cloth for menstrual protection, says NFHS.

Mr. Arora then began with his presentation by explaining the very basic structure and requirements for scholarships and studies. He explained that the process of applying in a foreign university should be meticulously planned and every step must be followed carefully. Advice was given that students should engage in regular reading of books and research papers and also indulge in writing as many research papers as possible. Furthermore, formats and requirements of an application form were discussed. An application has to be attached with various documents and in this session, Mr. Arora explained each document required, in extensive detail. Beginning with the form, an Applications form includes all the personal and professional details. Copies of the marksheets of the previously undertaken Bachelors, Masters and Diplomas need to be attached. Then comes the competitive exam scores. For a PhD in English the students are required to give some important competition exams like GRE, TOEFL, IELTS etc. Good scores of these exams are essential to prove the merit of any student. Mr. Arora along with describing the exam process suggested many books to refer to take these exams. Next, comes the Statement of Purpose, which is the most crucial part of an application. This is a document specifying who you are, reasons for opting for a particular university and why you are planning to undertake the course and what are your plans after completing the course. A well written Statement of Purpose will be the key to a good university. Other required documents are Resume, which should be effectively written with powerful words, Letter of Recommendation, which can be taken from the department professors and also from professors outside the department. This will signify that the student is not only good in his/her department but also well known among other fields i.e, this reflects the versatility of a student. The session was extremely helpful and informative for the students planning to pursue studies in foreign countries. Mr. Siddharth Arora successfully elucidated on every significant aspect for an application and tests to be taken. All the students were truly grateful and were benefited immensely by this session. The students rated this Alumni session as the best as they felt every aspect of the talk was covered in great detail.









22. Phoenix Inked Essay Competition Report:

'Phoenix Inked', the National Essay Writing Competition was organised by Jaipuria Institute of Management and St. Xavier's College, Jaipur. 
23. Feed o Wings: Coordinator Dr Rama Hirawat

13. "Rang De Sukoon": Social intitiative



Details of the Activities organized/ Work Performed

1. Poster Making Competition


4. Career Counselling Session by T.I.M.E Institute

6. Virtual Industrial Visit






9. Webinar on Consumer Awareness

12. Connect with Work - Soft Skill Training Programme Workshop


