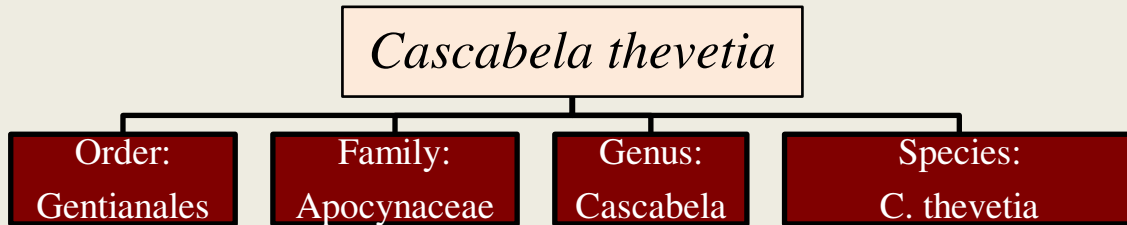


Common Name: Kaner



DESCRIPTION

- Mexican oleander is a large shrub or a small tree, up to 10 to 20 feet tall with Oleander-like leaves mostly in whorls of three, long and narrow up to 10 inches long.
- Tip of leafs are pointed with a dark green color. Flowers are generally yellow, but there are varieties with white and orange flowers too.
- Fruit is small, containing two to four flat seeds.
- If ingested may experience pain in the mouth and lips, may also develop vomiting, cramping, abdominal pain, nausea and bradycardia shortly after ingestion.
- Mexican oleander is native to tropical America.
