# Informative Session on Minority Scholarships available to students of Minority Communities

On Thursday, 4<sup>th</sup> October 2023, The Minorities Welfare Committee of St. Xavier's College, Jaipur is organizing an Informative Session on Minority Scholarships available to students of minority. The event commenced with a touching prayer by Lesley Elsa Mathew, whose words resonated with hope and unity, setting the stage for what would be an unforgettable gathering. Sr. Dr. Ligimol Louis, with her eloquent introductory note, paved the way for the journey toward educational empowerment. Father Principal S. Xavier SJ, in a speech that stirred souls, became the guiding light of inspiration for everyone present.

The Speaker of the session was Dr Salim Khan, Assistant Professor, Department of Business Administration St Xavier's College- Jaipur. The lecture started with an interactive session where the speaker told about the objective of the scheme is to **award scholarships to meritorious students belonging to economically weaker sections of minority community** so as to provide them better opportunities for higher education, increase their rate of attainment in higher education and enhance their employability. Students belonging to six notified minority communities viz. Muslim, Christian, Sikh, Buddhist, Jain, Parsi (Zoroastrian) studying in India only and fulfilling the Scheme guidelines are eligible to apply for these scholarships. The Pre-Matric, Post Matric and Merit cum Means based Scholarship Schemes are online Schemes and one can apply for fresh or renewal Scholarship under any of these Schemes on the National Scholarship Portal (NSP) at www.scholarships.gov.in. Link to the Portal is also provided on the website of the Ministry of Minority Affairs, i.e. www.minorityaffairs.gov.in. An online undertaking has to be submitted for registration on the NSP by applicants who are above the age of 18 years and by the parents/guardian if the applicant is below the age of 18 years.

The Session was ended by an Interactive Round where students were asked to raise their queries and questions, which was satisfactorily answered by the Speaker. It turned out to be great success as students attending and extracting valuable knowledge out of it.
