Preparing Ourselves for NAAC

As we mark the successful completion of the **NAAC accreditation process** for the **first cycle** at **St. Xavier's College Jaipur**, it is a moment of immense pride and gratitude. This milestone is not just a recognition of our institutional excellence but also a testament to our unwavering perseverance and dedication over the years. The seeds of our NAAC accreditation journey were sowed in 2014, under the leadership of **Late Father Sebastian Anand SJ**, then Principal of the college. He encouraged us to explore the NAAC manual and assess our eligibility for accreditation. At that time, we had already graduated two batches, making us eligible; however, we still required 2f and 12B recognition. The accreditation process was then a qualitative review based on six criteria, demanding extensive documentation.

Due to unforeseen circumstances, followed by management changes, led to a temporary pause in our accreditation efforts. The process was revived in 2017 under the leadership of **Dr. Sheila Rai**, who took over as Principal. With the formation of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in May 2018, we gained the much-needed stability to align ourselves with the ever-evolving NAAC framework. By 2020, we were prepared to move forward, but the transition to our new Nevta campus in 2021 and the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic delayed our efforts. Despite these hurdles, we remained committed – conducting academic audits, digitizing documentation, and adopting best practices.

The real momentum came in 2023 with the arrival of the new principal, **Father Xavier Savarimuthu, SJ**, who prioritized NAAC accreditation from day one. His leadership provided the IQAC with the encouragement to take decisive steps, including benchmarking against top-rated institutions and refining our internal processes. However, our journey did not conclude with the initial accreditation process. The NAAC assessment was followed by an intense appeal process and an online NAAC Revisit, which required additional efforts in documentation and justification. After this rigorous evaluation, the college was finally awarded the prestigious **NAAC 'A' Grade** in January 2025. This achievement underscores our resilience and determination to uphold the highest standards of academic excellence.

The past year has been particularly demanding, with the IQAC team, heads of the departments, faculty members, and non-teaching staff members working tirelessly, even on weekends and holidays, to meet the rigorous NAAC requirements. The process involved an immense amount of data collection, coordination, and documentation – each criterion and metric posing unique challenges:

- **Criterion I:** Coordinating among departments and managing documentation was a formidable task.
- **Criterion II:** Being the highest-weighted criterion, it required meticulous data validation and collaboration with administrative teams.
- **Criterion III:** The cross-functional nature of this criterion made efficient teamwork essential.
- **Criterion IV:** Though seemingly straightforward, presenting the data in alignment with NAAC standards required strategic planning.
- **Criterion V:** This quantitatively intensive criterion demanded contributions from all units and alumni of the college.
- **Criterion VI:** The documentation-heavy nature of this criterion required extensive teamwork.
- **Criterion VII:** Showcasing institutional transformation over the years called for innovative thinking and creative presentation.

Throughout this journey, we experienced stressful deadlines, unforeseen challenges, and moments of exhaustion. The support of the present management, **Father Arokya Swamy, SJ**, **Father Xavier Savarimuthu, SJ**, **Father Raymond Cherubin, SJ**, **Father Amaldass, SJ**, and **Father Pradeep Indwar, SJ** has been the cornerstone of our efforts towards the NAAC accomplishment. This success would not have been possible without the contributions of the past management, including **Father Varkey Perekatt, SJ**, **Dr. Sheila Rai**, **Father Joshy Kuruvilla, SJ**, and **Father Sherry George, SJ**, who laid a strong foundation for the NAAC process. Their vision and guidance played a crucial role in shaping our approach. Finally, we extend our deepest gratitude to our faculty, staff, students, and alumni – their collective commitment, dedication, and perseverance have brought us to this remarkable milestone. The **NAAC 'A' Grade** is not just a certification but a testament to the strength of our community and our pursuit of excellence. As we celebrate this achievement, let us continue striving for academic innovation, quality enhancement, and institutional growth.

Exploration of NEP 2020 and NAAC Accreditation

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and NEP Task Force Committee, St. Xavier's College Jaipur, hosted an insightful session titled **"Exploration of NEP 2020 and NAAC Accreditation"** on **5 July 2023**, with the expert **Dr. Paul Newman**, who shared his expertise on the evolving educational landscape. The session aimed to enlighten faculty members on the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and its implications for achieving NAAC Accreditation. Dr. Newman elaborated on NAAC's five core values, emphasizing national





development, global competency, value-based education, technology integration, and excellence. He guided participants on self-assessment techniques, accreditation frameworks, and the revised Assessment & Accreditation (A&A) process, highlighting key tools such as the Self-Study Report (SSR), Institutional Information for Quality Assessment (IIQA), and Data Validation Visit (DVV). The session also covered Outcome-Based Education (OBE) and its role in improving learning outcomes. Faculty members, administrative staff, and IQAC members benefited from discussions on the revised criterion-wise weightage, grading system, and the role of IQAC in institutional preparedness. The session enhanced awareness, fostering a structured approach to accreditation, and equipped participants

with essential knowledge and strategies to align with NEP 2020 and NAAC's evolving framework for quality education and institutional excellence.

NAAC Criteria wise Presentations

To familiarize the staff of St. Xavier's College Jaipur, with the NAAC accreditation process, the Management organized a series of presentations on NAAC criteria every Saturday from **22 July 2023, to 15 August 2023**. Each of the seven criteria was covered through dedicated presentations, with faculty members assigned specific metrics for in-depth discussions. This collaborative initiative ensured active faculty participation, fostering a deeper understanding of the NAAC framework. The sessions played a crucial role in enhancing staff awareness and equipping them with the knowledge required for the accreditation process. The discussions, exchange of ideas, and clarification of doubts through group interactions made the initiative highly insightful and productive as the college steadily prepared for NAAC accreditation.



Visit of the Principal & IQAC Coordinator to Kolkata, Bengaluru, Coimbatore for NAAC Preparation

A delegation from St. Xavier's College Jaipur, comprising Principal, Prof. Fr. S. Xavier, SJ, Dean of Research, Fr. Dr. Amaldass, and IQAC Director, Prof. Yashwardhan Singh, visited three prestigious institutions—Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Centenary College (Rahara), University of Calcutta - Department of Botany (6-8 Oct 2023), Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous), Bengaluru (6-7 Dec 2023), and Nirmala College for Women (Autonomous), Coimbatore (8 Dec 2023). The visits aimed at gaining insights into NAAC accreditation preparations and fostering academic collaborations.

In Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Centenary College (Rahara), Principal of the college made a structured presentation on NAAC requirements, visited research labs, and signed an MoU. Additionally, at the University of Calcutta, the team explored research on sustainable agriculture and potential collaborations. At Kristu Jayanti College (Bengaluru), the team engaged in detailed discussions on NAAC documentation and visited key facilities, including the Centre for Research, Library, and Herbal Garden. The visit concluded with an MoU and valuable insights into accreditation strategies. At Nirmala College for Women (Coimbatore), the delegation visited various departments, research facilities, and museums, culminating in an MoU between the two institutions. The visit showcased the college's exemplary accreditation preparations, earning them a CGPA of 3.78. These visits reinforced institutional learning, best practices, and academic partnerships to enhance quality education.

Session on Understanding the NAAC Accreditation Framework

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) at St. Xavier's College Jaipur, successfully organized an online session on 'Understanding the NAAC Accreditation Framework' on 15 December 2023. In the session Dr. Pawlin Vasanthi Joseph, Associate Professor & Head, Department of Zoology, and IQAC Director at Nirmala College for Women (Autonomous), Coimbatore, as the resource person. The event provided valuable insights into the NAAC accreditation criteria,





assessment process, and best practices for institutional quality enhancement. Faculty members and administrative staff actively participated, gaining strategies to contribute effectively to accreditation efforts. Organized by the IQAC the session strengthened institutional growth through collaborative knowledge sharing. Key takeaways included understanding quality assurance parameters, improving educational standards, and aligning with accreditation benchmarks. The session concluded with an engaging discussion, addressing participant queries and reinforcing the importance of continuous improvement in education. This initiative marks a significant step toward enhancing the academic excellence of St. Xavier's College Jaipur, and

the IQAC looks forward to similar knowledge-sharing events in the future.

Session on National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) Process

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of St. Xavier's College, Jaipur organized a one day workshop on the **National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) Process** on **13 January 2024**. Xavier SJ, Principal of the College, emphasizing the importance of accreditation in maintaining academic excellence. A key highlight was the campus visit led by Dr. Kawday, allowing participants to observe real-time applications of accreditation principles. Faculty members, administrative staff, and IQAC members benefited significantly, gaining strategic insights into institutional quality enhancement. The workshop fostered a deeper commitment to academic excellence by equipping stakeholders with the knowledge and tools necessary for effective NAAC preparedness. The hands-on experience and expert discussions strengthened the institution's vision of continuous improvement, ensuring a robust foundation for future accreditation endeavors.



Assessment by the Team from Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous), Bengaluru



The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of **St. Xavier's College Jaipur** organised a workshop titled **"MOU Collaboration and NAAC's Expectations from Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs)"** on **23 January 2024**. The workshop aimed to provide a detailed understanding of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council's (NAAC) expectations from HEIs while enhancing and assessing the institutional preparedness for the accreditation process. The event covered crucial topics such as MOU Collaborations, NAAC Parameters and Criteria, Campus Visit

Preparedness, and the overall evaluation framework. The sessions were led by eminent resource persons, **Dr. Fr. Augustine George CMI**, Principal, and **Dr. Aloysius Edward J**, IQAC Director, both from Kristu Jayanti College (Autonomous), Bengaluru. They shared their expertise in quality assurance and accreditation, offering practical strategies to strengthen institutional readiness for NAAC evaluations. The discussions emphasized forming impactful MOUs to foster meaningful collaborations and promoting academic excellence through institutional partnerships. There was a documentation review for all the major units of the college by the IQAC Coordinator of Kristu Jayanti College. Participants, including faculty members, administrative staff, and key institutional stakeholders, actively engaged in the interactive sessions. Attendees gained valuable insights into NAAC processes, enhanced their strategic planning skills, and reignited their commitment to fostering collaborations aimed at institutional growth and development.

Presentations by Criterion Coordinators

St. Xavier's College Jaipur, successfully conducted a series of presentations by Criterion coordinators for **NAAC accreditation from 9-14 February 2024**. The sessions were aimed at reviewing institutional performance across all seven NAAC criteria and ensuring comprehensive documentation for accreditation. Each criteria coordinator delivered a detailed presentation covering key metrics, compliance status, best practices, and future roadmaps. The sessions began with Criterion I : Curriculum Aspects, followed by Criterion II : Teaching-Learning and Evaluation, and continued with other criteria focusing on





Research, Infrastructure, Student Support, Governance, and Institutional Values.

The presentations highlighted innovative initiatives, quality benchmarks, and evidence-based practices implemented by the institution. Coordinators addressed challenges, presented improvement plans, and responded to queries from the internal NAAC team. The interactive discussions provided valuable insights for strengthening institutional preparedness. The NAAC team appreciated the structured approach and data-driven presentations. The event concluded with a collective discussion on further enhancements to align with accreditation standards. The successful completion of these sessions marked a significant step toward achieving excellence in

higher education at St. Xavier's College Jaipur.

NAAC Audit by Prof. Joseph Dorairaj and Dr. Mary Magdalene

After working on the documentation meticulously for a couple of months, the college decided to get them thoroughly reviewed by experts. Thus, the IQAC invited Prof Dorairaj and Dr Magdalene were invited for **4 days to review the documents criteria-wise** in detail to help us correct our flaws and rectify them well in time, from **19-22 February 2024**. The audit of documents was spread over 3 days, with the first three criteria on the first day. Metric wise presentation by each metric in-charge was done in the presence of the IQAC along with the Management and the Criterion team. Every document was minutely inspected and reviewed by the experts who gave numerous relevant suggestions for improving our documentation and its presentation. On day two, the next three criteria were taken up for a similar exercise. The third day was exclusively kept criterion VII as a lot of brainstorming and revisions were required for it. A general staff meeting followed by a meeting with all the criteria coordinators scheduled post lunch, followed by a review meeting with the IQAC. An exit meeting was conducted on the last day for giving general and overall feedback that was common to all criteria.



This criteria-wise audit laid the foundation for further revision and improvement in the preparation of our documents and their presentation. As a very useful exercise, the audit gave us the required direction and boost to keep going in the right spirit and direction.

The **First NAAC Peer Team Mock Visit** of St. Xavier's College Jaipur **organised by IQAC** took place on **18-19 May 2024** as part of the **gauging the institution's preparation for NAAC Accreditation**. The peer team thoroughly reviewed facilities, infrastructure, documentation and presentation providing constructive feedback on hospitality, showcasing and highlighting achievements, and improving key areas like the canteen and hostel facility. The team praised and encouraged the institution to highlight its unique endeavour in the form of Xavier's Vocational Institution (XVI) and other skill-building programs run by the college to empower the community around it. The team also brought to the forefront how departmental achievements can be better showcased. They focused on Mentor-Mentee records, putting more effort into increasing student awareness about the

various statutory committees, scholarships offered by the institution and the institutional best practices. The team appreciated the state-of-the-art facilities offered in the library. They stressed the need for proper and sequential documentation of the activities and better presentation of the achievements, focusing on institution distinctiveness. There was thorough feedback on the manner of department and unit presentations to make them crisp, brief and engaging, highlighting institutional innovation and uniqueness for better NAAC grading. The visit concluded with a suggestion for the institution to reflect on its strengths effectively, ensuring a successful accreditation process. The mock visit gave a roadmap for the actual preparation of the NAAC Peer Team Visit.

The **Second NAAC Peer Team Mock Visit** was conducted by the IQAC on **19-20 July 2024** to have a final run-through of the entire preparation, including the cultural programme that will be presented in the evening. It was a meticulous review done to assess the institution's preparedness for the upcoming NAAC Visit.

The team went into the minutest of details to help us brush up on our documentation and presentation. They assessed the academic ambience of the institution, documentation, infrastructure, and student engagement. The Peer Members commended the initiatives like the Innovation and Incubation Cell (IIC) for nurturing entrepreneurial talent and student-led creative societies for fostering holistic development. The interaction with the parents, students, and alumni revealed a good level of satisfaction with the college's quality of education and its efforts to make environmentally conscious and socially responsible citizens.

They suggested certain improvements, like better coordination for hospitality, especially having a backup plan in case of rain, streamlining presentations to highlight the strengths of the college, and training students about the college's best practices. The team also highlighted the need for filling gaps in facilities like the hostel and canteen while appreciating the institution's progress. The visit helped us take care of practical issues that may or may not arise just before the final visit with their feedback reflecting the college's commitment to continuous improvement.

The NAAC Peer Team visited St. Xavier's College Jaipur on **25-26 July 2024** to assess and evaluate the academic quality and practices, the infrastructure, student initiatives and community engagement as outlined under the seven criteria in the NAAC Manual. The team appreciated student projects like Aquaponics, *Ayush Udyan*, and initiatives in start-ups under IIC – including the student who was a Shark Tank Winner. Their meeting with the Alumni highlighted the success stories of the Alumni and how the institution has groomed them and given them a platform to hone their skills, preparing them for future success. The team was extremely impressed by the digitalisation of the library, which enables students to access books online and practice question papers from the previous years of various competition exams and university exams through the institutional repository called D-Space. They also appreciated the *Divyangjan*-friendly features of the library and the entire campus. The suggestions put forward by the team included enhanced documentation further showcasing achievements and addressing gaps like hostel facilities. The visit concluded with the Exit Meeting, where the team commended the institution's team spirit and efforts made towards offering a holistic education, emphasising the institution's further potential for excellence.

Appeal to NAAC by St. Xavier's College Jaipur

St. Xavier's College Jaipur, filed an appeal with the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) challenging the grade awarded following the assessment by the NAAC Peer Team, citing concerns over improper evaluation of the college's qualitative metrics. The appeal application, requesting a Revisit by another Peer Team, was submitted on **12 October 2024**. NAAC **accepted the application** on **21 October 2024**, scheduling it for presentation before the Appeal Committee. On **8 November 2024**, the Principal of St. Xavier's College, along with the IQAC Coordinator, made a passionate presentation supporting their appeal to the Appeal Committee, highlighting the discrepancies in the previous assessment. After a thorough review, NAAC accepted the

appeal and approved an online Revisit for 8 qualitative metrics by a new Peer Team, scheduled for **9-10 January 2025**. This development marks an important step towards ensuring a fair and comprehensive evaluation of the college's academic and institutional quality.

The Re-Visit of the NAAC Peer Team began with the **Director, NAAC, Prof. Ganesh Kannabiran** addressing the Peer Team and the College Team online. The members were informed that this visit would be the first in many things – **first in being a Virtual Visit** and **first in being an online re-visit after the appeal, first online experience for the overseers as well**. He encouraged the Peer Team members to take their time to experience the institution as if it was a physical visit and get enough clarifications that would assist in re-evaluation. Next, the chairperson of the NAAC Peer Team, **Dr. Siddu P Algur**, addressed and welcomed the attendees, congratulating the innovations brought about by NAAC. The re-visit began with a comprehensive presentation by the Principal followed by elaborate presentations made by various faculty members on the 8 metrics that the re-visit was based upon. The presentation for



Criterion I & II, made by Dr. Atiq Kelsey and Dr. Shruti Rawal included scrutiny of lesson plans, academic calendars, POs and COs, and attainment of graduate attributes. Dr. Shikha Arora Bakshi under Criterion III highlighted MSME awardee Anushka Jain and the start-up by our alumni Silver Tree that was appreciated by the then Chief Minister Shri Ashok Gehlot. The IQAC Coordinator Mr. Yashwardhan Singh focused on aspects of Governance while Dr. Ritu Mehra shared the details under the institution's social extension activities. Knowledge Transfer programmes like Mushroom Cultivation, *Jeevamrit*, Centre for Employability, and other UBA initiatives were highlighted. Programmes like ICDL were appreciated and the awards and laurels bagged by our students under NSS, NCC, Rovers and Rangers, SAP, and UBA were highlighted. The Covid-Care Centre set up by the alumni during the pandemic was well taken. The Alumni interaction was the highlight of the day with the Alumni focusing and restating the role of their alma mater in their all-round development and their present success. Another fruitful interaction of the Peer Team was with the Governing Body. The members interacted and answered queries like how appointments are done, institutional policy regarding curriculum dissemination, decentralisation of power, prospects and how the institution plans to sustain in the future. The students also reported live from the UBA Villages, *Ayush Udyan*, Waste Management Plant, Aquaponics and other places to give a glimpse of the work that is done by the college. The Peer Team also asked for some documents to be mailed for further evaluation and verification. The day concluded with the Exit Meeting between the Peer Team, the Principal and the IQAC coordinator where the Peer Team gave its overall inputs and shared the report drafted by the team.

NAAC Process Timeline

St. Xavier's College Jaipur, embarked on its First Cycle of NAAC accreditation journey with the submission of the **Institutional Information for Quality Assessment (IIQA) on 29 February 2024**. This was followed by the submission of the Self-Study Report (SSR) on 25 April 2024, detailing the college's academic and institutional achievements. **The Data Validation and Verification (DVV) process took place between 9-24 May 2024**, ensuring the accuracy and credibility of the submitted data. Subsequently, the **NAAC Peer Team Visit (PTV) was conducted on 25-26 July 2024** to evaluate the qualitative aspects of the institution. Dissatisfied with the outcome of assessment, the college filed an official appeal on **8 November 2024, requesting a Revisit**. NAAC accepted the appeal, and an online **Revisit by a new Peer Team was scheduled for 9-10 January 2025**. The college was finally graded with an **A grade** by NAAC, achieving a **CGPA of 3.06 on 16 January 2025**, marking the successful completion of its **first cycle of NAAC accreditation**.

9 November 2024



Talk Session - Know Your Army (Armed Forces)


2 December 2024

Workshop on the occasion of the International Year of Millets 2023


9 December 2024


